2020 CLASS AND DIVISION SPECIFICATIONS

NOVICE ARENA

<u>Leadline</u> Entries to show both directions at the walk. Open to riders 8 & under (Age as of December 1st, 2019)

Walk Hunter, Walk/Trot Equitation with Handler, Walk/Trot Hunter with Handler Entries to W/T with handler both directions. Once riders cross enter into W/T they are no longer eligible for W/T with handler. Open to riders 10 & under (Age as of December 1st, 2019)

<u>Novice Rider Walk/Trot Hunter, Pleasure, Command, and Equitation</u> Open to any age rider who has not cantered at a show. Year end points follow the rider (may change mounts throughout the season). No cross entry into W/T Poles or X-Rails.

<u>Walk/Trot Poles Equitation & Hunter Open to any age rider who has not cantered at a show.</u> Year end points follow the rider (may change mounts throughout the season). No cross entry into W/T or W/T X-Rails.

<u>Walk/Trot X-Rails Equitation & Hunter</u> Open to any age rider who has not cantered at a show. Year end points follow the rider (may change mounts throughout the season). No cross entry into W/T or W/T Poles. Once riders enter into Beginner X-Rails they are no longer eligible for W/T.

<u>Beginner X-Rails Equitation & Hunter</u> Open to riders in their 1st or 2nd year of showing. Year end points follow the rider (may change mounts throughout the season). Flat classes to walk, trot, and canter. Jump courses are crossrail fences at a canter. *Simple changes are allowed.* Once riders enter into Short Stirrup they are no longer eligible for X-Rails.

<u>Open X-Rails Hunter</u> Open to young horses or ponies in their 1st or 2nd year of showing. Flat classes to walk and trot. Jump course is crossrail fences, at a trot *or* canter. *Simple changes are allowed*. Once horse or pony cross enters into Baby Green they are no longer eligible for Open X-Rails.

<u>Master Rider Poles and X-rails</u> Open to mature riders who are stepping up or stepping down in their careers. Points will follow riders for year end awards.

<u>Short/Long Stirrup Equitation & Hunter</u> Fences 18" & 21". Open to novice juniors and adults in their 1st or 2nd year of cantering over fences. Riders that have competed over fences higher than 2' are ineligible. *Simple changes are allowed.* Once riders enter into Intermediate they are no longer eligible for SS.

<u>Baby Green Hunter</u> Gates and boxes 18" & 21". Open to horses and ponies in their first two (2) years of showing. *Simple changes are allowed.* Once horse or pony is cross entered into Green Hunter they are no longer eligible for Baby Green.

<u>Intermediate Equitation & Hunter</u> Fences 2' (no oxers). Riders not to have jumped over 2'3" in a show. Simple changes are allowed.

Novice riders may <u>only</u> cross enter into pleasure or model in Main Hunter Ring

HUNTER ARENA

<u>Model Classes</u> Judged on conformation and way of going (may only use one model class towards Year End High Point)

<u>Pleasure Classes</u> To show at the walk, trot, and canter both ways of the ring. Pleasure ponies to be shown by a junior rider.

<u>Hunter Hack</u> To show at the walk, trot, and canter both ways of the ring. To jump two fences. Riders may choose to jump a height of 2' or 2'6". May be asked to hand gallop. Open to horses and ponies.

<u>Green Hunter</u> Fences 2' or 2'6". Open to horses and ponies in their first 2 years of showing at 2' or higher.

<u>Permormance Hunter</u> Fences 3'3 or 3'6. Open to horses and ponies.

Open Hunter Fences 2'9" or 3'. Open to horses and ponies.

<u>Thoroughbred Hunter</u> Fences 2'3" or 2'6". Open to identifiable thoroughbreds registered with the Jockey Club

<u>Modified Equitation & Hunter</u> Fences 2'3". Riders not to have jumped over 2'6" in a show. Riders may *only* cross enter into pleasure, hunter hack at 2', and jumpers at 2'6" or lower.

<u>Children's Pony Equitation & Hunter</u> Fences 2' or 2'6". Junior riders on ponies. Small/Medium ponies to jump 2', Large ponies to jump 2'6". Flat classes will be combined.

<u>Low Children/Adult Amateur Equitation & Hunter</u> Fences 2'6" Horse ridden by adult or junior at amateur status who have never jumped over 3' at a show. No cross entry into Children/Adult on the same day.

<u>Children/Adult Amateur Equitation & Hunter</u> Fences 2'9" or 3' Horse ridden by adult or junior at amateur status. No cross entry to Low Children/Adult on the same day.

<u>High Children/Adult Equitation/Hunter</u> Fences 3,3 to 3'6. May cross enter into Children/Adult on a different mount.

MSC Mini Medal Rider's choose to jump a height of 2'6" or 3'. MSC Junior members on horses. Will be run as an open card. Top four to test at judge's discretion. 1st and 2nd place winners will qualify for Year End Medal Finals in December-Final Show will begin with Medal Classes (no warm up)

<u>MSC Pony Medal</u> Rider's to choose a jump height of 2' or 2'6". MSC Junior members on ponies. Will be run as an open card. 1st and 2nd place winners will qualify for Year End Medal Finals in December-Final Show will begin with Medal Classes (no warm up)

<u>Warm Ups</u> An UNJUDGED jump course offered before each height section to enable horse and rider to practice before entering their division.

The progression of rider entries in Hunter/Equitation over a period of time usually goes Walk/Trot, Beginner Crossrails, Short Stirrup, Intermediate Rider, Modified Rider, Low Children's/Adult, Children's/Adult, and High Children's/Adult. Once a rider has moved up a division it is not appropriate to move back down. (intermediate to modified then go back to intermediate) It is the rider/trainer's responsibility to read class specs and contact show management prior to show with any questions. The show management is NOT responsible to proofread your entries. If an anomaly arises the show management will investigate. Points may be forfeited if a rider is entered in a division they are not eligible for.
